rtment responded to 470 calls service. Currently we are approximately 35 calls over where we were this time last year. At this time the fire department needs paid on-call firefighters. We have 14 members currently, but our roster is 24 positions. If you would like to serve your community in the capacity of a firefighter, we would love to talk to you. All training and protective equipment is supplied by the fire department. You can get an application by stopping by the township or city offices, contacting me, or it can be found on our new website at galesburgcharlestonfiredepartment.org. It can be turned in at either office. There is a national firefighter shortage and recruitment is an issue. If you have friends or family members who live in other cities or states that might be interested in firefighting

as a career or as a volunteer, encourage them to apply. It is a rewarding job.

This year the department applied for a FEMA Firefighters Assistance Grant for a gear dryer and air bottle cascade filling station. On July 19th, I received a call from Senator Peters' office congratulating us on our grant being awarded. A couple days later the official notification email from FEMA arrived. We are in the process of ordering the equipment in accordance with the guidelines established by FEMA.

Just a reminder that notification to the Fire Chief is required for any open burning. I can be reached at (269)720-2118. As always, the Galesburg Charleston Firefighters and I would like to thank the citizens and board members for your continued support.

# From the Desk of Supervisor, Jerry Vander Roest

**Roads - Where does money come from?** Public Act 51 provides road funding to the State Trunkline, counties, cities, and villages, but not township governments. Along with money from our General Fund, the Township gets participation funds (par funds). The Road Commission of Kalamazoo County gives townships money based on a formula and the townships are required to match that funding.

Charleston Township has 28 miles of roads that we are responsible to take care of. We have fought to keep Miller Dr. and S. 38th St (1/2 mile-south of MN Ave) as primary roads but was unable to convince the Road Commission. Both roads were recently paved before becoming our responsibility. The following is what we have taken out of the General Fund to maintain a good road system.




